ORDINANCE NO. SP- 1384 , s-2004

AN ORDINANCE EXEMPTING CERTAIN PRIVATE MARKETS AND SLAUGHTERHOUSES SPECIFIED HEREIN, FROM THE FRANCHISE REQUIREMENT AS PROVIDED UNDER SECTION 1, CHAPTER VI11 OF ORDINANCE NO. SP-944, S-2000.

WHEREAS, the City Council is aware that a considerable number of public markets and slaughterhouses, notwithstanding their lack of a franchise to operate as mandated, have timely and substantially complied with the provisions of the Quezon City Market Code and Revenue Code;

WHEREAS, the application and implementation of the Quezon City Market Code should be pursuant to the principle that those who are in substantial compliance with the law should be given a certain degree of incentive and that the law should be applied prospectively,

WHEREAS, the following private markets and/or slaughterhouses:

a number of which have been in existence even prior to the enactment of both the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160) and the Quezon City Market Code, have timely and substantially complied with the provisions of the Quezon City Market Code;
