AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POPULATION INFORMATION AND MONITORING CENTER (PIMC) IN ALL BARANGAYS IN QUEZON CITY, APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 384 of R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1990, "As basic political unit, the barangay serves as the primary planning and implementing unit of government policies, plans, programs, projects and activities in the community, and as a forum wherein the collective views of the people may be expressed, crystallized and considered";

WHEREAS, Section 394 d (6) of the Local Government Code of 1991, mandates the Barangay Secretary to keep an updated record of all inhabitants of the barangay containing the following items of information: name, address, place and date of birth, sex, civil status, citizenship, occupation, and such other items of information as may be prescribed by law or ordinances;

WHEREAS, Section 37 of R.A. No. 7279, otherwise known as the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992 (UDHA), mandates local government units to "set up an effective mechanism to monitor trends in the movements of population in collaboration with Population Commission, the National Economic and Development Authority and the National Statistics Office, among others, to set up an effective mechanism to monitor population movements, such measure is intended to serve as an early warning system for local areas on the potentially serious demographic and socio-economic implications that might be brought about by prevailing trends in population movement;
