**WHEREAS**, it is the policy of the Quezon City government to establish universal quality education to all its residents through the construction of various Educational Institution that would cater to its burgeoning population;

**WHEREAS**, the Commonwealth Elementary School (CES) Annex was built due to the over population of enrollees in the main school, the Commonwealth Elementary School;

**WHEREAS**, at present, the population of CES Annex has grown to about Four Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Eight (4,358) pupils, manned by eighty-three (83) teachers, three (3) non-teaching staff and a principal, has already been practically operating as a separate school from its main school, Commonwealth Elementary School, for over two school years now;
