BARANGAY HALLS AND MULTIPURPOSE BUILDINGS IN  
QUEZON CITY.

*WHEREAS, Section 13, Article X of the Constitution of the  
Philippines states that: Local government units may group  
themselves, consolidate or coordinate their efforts, services,  
and resources for purposes commonly beneficial to them in  
accordance with law; †*

WHEREAS, Section 448 of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that: *Role of the City.* - The city, consisting of more urbanized and developed Barangays, serves as a general-purpose government for the coordination and delivery of basic, regular, and direct services and effective governance of the inhabitants within its territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has prohibited the use of names and images of officials in billboards and signages of DILG programs and projects funded by Performance Challenge Fund;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of the Philippines accords every local government unit power and authority to promote the general welfare within its territorial jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. Title – This Ordinance shall be known as “Uniform Color of all Barangay Hall and Multipurpose Hall Ordinance of Quezon City.”

SECTION 2. Purpose – It is the purpose of this ordinance to:

- a. Promote coordination among its offices and establishment as well as to show uniformity among all its constituents.
- b. For Quezon City to be identified to be a united City through its uniform colors.
- c. To prevent use of any Political Color in all Public Establishments and Local Government Unit Offices. *γ*

*SECTION 3. Coverage – This Ordinance shall apply to all Barangay Halls and Multipurpose Halls situated within the jurisdiction of Quezon City.*

*SECTION 4. Uniform Color – The Uniform Color for the Barangay Halls and Multipurpose Halls situated within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City shall be:*

- a. Kitten White (p112 sG) for the Body and Roof*
- b. Copper Bright (p82 sG) for the Border accents*
- c. Pure Ivory (p99 sG) for the Body accents.*

*Since these are generic color and are not identifiable to any political party or local government official of Quezon City. In addition to this, it can be easily maintained.*

*SECTION 5. Implementation – The provisions of this ordinance shall be adopted by all barangay and multipurpose halls within the jurisdiction of Quezon City, upon the passage of this ordinance. This uniform color shall be adopted only on their scheduled repainting and shall also be adopted by newly established and about-to-be-established barangay halls and multipurpose halls.*

*SECTION 6. Enforcement – This shall form part of Building Maintenance in Quezon City, upon request, the Engineering Department shall be in charge of the buildings described herein located within the jurisdiction of Quezon City.*

*SECTION 7. Funding – The funding for such shall be taken from the Annual Budget allocated for the Building Maintenance of Quezon City.*


*SECTION 8. Repealing Clause – All ordinances contrary to or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. ✕*




*SECTION 9. Separability Clause – If any part or provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other parts or provisions hereof.*

*SECTION 10. Effectivity Clause – This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.*


