RESOLUTION NO. SP-438, S-95

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING THE QUEZON CITY LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD TO GRANT INCENTIVE PAY TO THE SCHOOLS DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT, ONE (1) ASSISTANT DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT, NINETEEN (19) DIVISION SUPERVISORS, AND THE EIGHT (8) DISTRICT SUPERVISORS, ALL OF THE DIVISION OF CITY SCHOOLS, QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, the Schools Division Superintendent, the Assistant Schools Division Superintendent, the Nineteen (19) Division Supervisors, and the Eight (8) District Supervisors rose from the ranks and have served the Division of City Schools, Quezon City for a period ranging from six (6) to thirty-eight (38) years;

WHEREAS, during all these years, the aforementioned school officials have performed their duties and responsibilities effectively and efficiently of supervising the ninety-one (91) elementary schools and forty-one (41) secondary schools and annexes of Quezon City, including those which are difficult to reach and in remote areas;

WHEREAS, in addition to their normal workload, these school officials have conducted, coordinated, and participated in training programs/projects sponsored by the Quezon City Government in such areas as student development, human resource development, curriculum development, research, facilities development, as well

as community development, even beyond their official time, including Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays, without additional compensation;


WHEREAS, in spite of the volume of work shouldered by these school officials, they remain among the lowest paid in the government service, especially after the Quezon City Government adopted a new upgraded salary schedule for its employees;

WHEREAS, in recognition of the invaluable services being rendered by the above-named school officials, and to inspire them to persevere with their dedicated services, an incentive pay should be granted to them, in such amount as the School Board may determine;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby strongly urge, the Quezon City School Board to grant incentive pay to the Schools Division Superintendent in the amount of Four Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P4,500.00) per month, Four Thousand Pesos (P4,000.00) per month to one (1) Assistant Division Superintendent and Three Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-Six Pesos (P3,936.00) per month for each of the nineteen (19) Division Supervisors and the eight (8) District Supervisors, all of the Division of City Schools, Quezon City.
