"AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE MAGNA CARTA OF THE OUT-OF-SCHOOL  
YOUTH"

WHEREAS, Section 13, Article II of the 1987 Constitution recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being. The State shall inculcate in the youth, patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs;

WHEREAS, almost 20% of the 42.18 million Filipino children and youth were identified by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) as out-of-school in 2022. Among the reasons cited were: finished schooling (21.1%), employment (19.7%), lack of personal interest (12.6%), marriage (10.7%), and high cost of education/financial problem (9.9%);

WHEREAS, Out-of-School youth (OSY), as defined by the PSA, refers to 15–30 year-old youth who are not working and did not finish college or post-secondary course. Out of around 663,000 population aged 15-24 years, the number of OSYs in Quezon City reached around 157,000 in 2021; this indicates that 1 out of every 4 Quezon City youth is an OSY;
