A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE PROFOUND CONDOLENCES OF THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR, THE HONORABLE CITY VICE MAYOR AND THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE QUEZON CITY COUNCIL TO THE BEREAVED FAMILY OF THE LATE CITY COUNCILOR, HONORABLE REYNALDO N. MEDINA WHO DIED ON JULY 1, 2002 IN QUEZON CITY.

Medina, former councilor representing the 2nd District of Quezon City, succumbed to death leaving behind him his bereaved wife Adelina and children Raul, Reynaldo Jr., Reynaldo III, Redel, Nini, Elma and Eric;

WHEREAS, Coun. Medina who was elected in 1992 and served his term until 1995, has discharged his duties and provided services to the people with utmost dedication and devotion, justice and fairness without undue discrimination or favors;

WHEREAS, he was a simple and fine gentleman who, in spite of his position in life, has lived a modest life and is not known to have indulged in ostentatious or extravagant living;

WHEREAS, he has introduced numerous meaningful and significant pieces of legislations covering mostly on the maintenance of peace and order and security, and the protection and improvement of the lives of policemen;


WHEREAS, before his election as City Councilor, he had been serving the people of Quezon City in the field of endeavor which was almost nearest to his heart, viz., the suppression of criminality and the maintenance of peace and security in the City, matters which were of critical importance to him. He started his career as a police detective in 1957 and, thereafter, rose from the ranks until his appointment as full pledged Police Major. He was also a recipient of numerous awards in recognition of his selfless dedication and dynamic leadership;

WHEREAS, Christians believed that the death of a person has freed him from all the evils in this temporal world, released from pain and sorrow, frustrations and fear, poverty and sufferings, trouble and distress and will join his Divine Creator in peace and serenity, unity and harmony, fulfillment and happiness. 
NOW, THEREFORE,
