A RESOLUTION STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE QUEZON CITY PERFORMING ARTS DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION, INC. (QCPADFI) IN PROVIDING TRAININGS IN DANCE AND OTHER ASPECTS OF THE PERFORMING ARTS TO THE CITY'S GIFTED BUT UNDERPRIVILEGED YOUTHS OF QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, Quezon City Performing Arts Development Foundation, Inc. (QCPADFI) was established in September 2001 to manage the city government's Performing Arts Development Project under former Mayor Ismael A. Mathay in 1994 in order to provide trainings in dance and other aspects of the performing arts to the city's gifted but underprivileged youth of Quezon City;

WHEREAS, Quezon City Performing Arts Development Foundation, Inc. (QCPADFI), whose Board of Trustees are comprised of members of the artistic, cultural and business sectors, represents an effort by Mayor Feliciano R. Belmonte, to bring in the experiences and skills of the private sector to set the agenda for the strategic expansion and development of the program;

WHEREAS, the Foundation embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising and public relations program to gather support from the private sector and invite them to be equal partners of the local government in arts and cultural development in Quezon City;


WHEREAS, the Foundation is working towards increasing the number of its scholars from around 100 to 150 in 2002 in order to further accommodate the many gifted but underprivileged boys and girls of Quezon City that dream of receiving world class training in the performing arts;

WHEREAS, the Foundation also hopes to implement guidelines to ensure that all eligible applicants of Quezon City's four districts are given equal opportunities of being awarded scholarships, and that all four districts are adequately represented.


NOW, THEREFORE,
