RESOLUTION NO. SP-1981, S-2002

A RESOLUTION URGING HONORABLE FELICIANO R. BELMONTE, JR., CITY MAYOR, TO REQUEST P/CHIEF SR. SUPT. NAPOLEON C. CASTRO, DISTRICT DIRECTOR, CENTRAL POLICE DISTRICT COMMAND, TO CAUSE THE ASSIGNMENT OF PLAINCLOTHES POLICEMEN IN THE VICINITY OF BANKS, SHOPPING MALLS AND OTHER CRITICAL COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS/AREAS IN QUEZON CITY TO MONITOR THE MOVEMENTS OF SUSPICIOUS-LOOKING CHARACTERS AND/OR THE COMMISSION OF SYNDICATED CRIMES IN THE AREA FOR PROPER ACTION.

WHEREAS, the visibility of uniformed policemen and security guards in the vicinity of banks, shopping malls, and other critical establishments/areas makes them easy targets by syndicated lawless elements in a bank robbery, hold-up, kidnap for ransom, carnapping, and other related crimes, to elude arrest or facilitate their escape;

WHEREAS, stationary or roving plainclothes policemen equipped, among others, with hand-held radio-transceivers in the vicinity of banks, shopping malls and other critical commercial establishments/areas within the jurisdiction of Quezon City can secretly and effectively monitor the movements of suspicious-looking characters and/or commissions of crimes to roving police patrol cars/headquarters;


WHEREAS, the vital information relayed by plainclothes policemen through portable radios to roving police mobile cars/headquarters, such as the nature of the crime committed, the number and description of the perpetrators, the type, color and plate number of their get-away car/s and direction/s taken etc., will enable the effective coordination of hot pursuit operation, interception, roadblockade, neutralization or apprehension of the criminals, as the case may be.

Napoleon C. Castro, District Director, Central Police District Command, to cause the assignment of plainclothes policemen in the vicinity of banks, shopping malls and other critical commercial establishments/areas in Quezon City to monitor the movements of suspicious-looking characters and/or commission of syndicated crimes in the area for proper action.
