RESOLUTION NO. SP **2264** S-2003

A RESOLUTION DIRECTING AND AUTHORIZING THE MARKET DEVELOPMENT AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT (MDAD), HEADED BY MR. NEIL R. LINA, ASSISTANT CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND CITY MARKET ADMINISTRATOR, TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE POSSIBLE VENDING SITES IN QUEZON CITY AND TO SUBMIT TO THE CITY COUNCIL A REPORT WITHIN SIXTY (60) DAYS.

WHEREAS, the City Council is empowered by the Local Government Code to pass laws, ordinances, resolutions and measures beneficial, meaningful, effective and responsive for the promotion of the general welfare of its constituents and to regulate activities, movements and undertakings within the territorial jurisdiction in consonance with existing laws, rules and regulations;

WHEREAS, the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), thru MMDA Resolution 02-28, has been summarily clearing the vendors of Quezon City;

WHEREAS, of approximately Fifteen Thousand (15,000) vendors proliferating in Quezon City, about thirty-three percent (33%) have been displaced and whose livelihoods were greatly affected by the continuous clearing operation by the MMDA;

WHEREAS, the City Council had passed Ordinance No. SP-993, S-2000 providing for the regulation and security of vendors in their workplace pursuant to E.O. 452, entitled, "Security of Registered Vendors, in the workplace", signed on October 24, 1997;

WHEREAS, Article 25, Section 93 of the Quezon City Revenue Code (SP-91, S-93) provides that the "City Mayor shall declare with the concurrence of the Sangguniang Panlungsod temporary vending sites/areas where perishable and non-perishable goods or merchandise may be sold;"

WHEREAS, as of this date no site has been declared by the City Mayor and the Council as a vending site, hence, it is imperative that in order to avoid economic dislocation and distortion, a moratorium is necessary pending final identification of appropriate vending site for the purpose;

WHEREAS, Market Development and Administration Department has classified city roads into four (4) major categories such as: Class A (critical), situated along main thoroughfares, market vicinities and other busy areas that cause obstruction to traffic and affect health and sanitation, are considered under MMDA's local jurisdiction;


WHEREAS, Class B (less critical), which is situated on secondary streets/government lots, branching from class A which has minimal adverse effects on the public; Class C (non-critical), which is situated on inner streets with no adverse effect on the public; Class D (negligible), which has one or two small groups of vendors with no adverse effects on the public, are areas under Quezon City government-MDAD's local jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, it is the primary duty of the City government to assist its less fortunate constituents like the vendors.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED, to direct and authorize, as it does hereby direct and authorize, the Market Development Administration Department (MDAD), headed by Mr. Neil R. Lina, Assistant City Administrator and City Market Administrator, to conduct a study of the possible vending sites in Quezon City and to submit to the City Council a report within sixty (60) days.


RESOLVED, FURTHER, that in order to avoid economic dislocation, distortion, and chaos among the vendors and the law enforcers, the Quezon City Department of Public Order and Safety, the Central Police District Office, the Quezon City Market Development and Administration Department (MDAD), and the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), are hereby directed to refrain from demolishing structures, and confiscating wares and other vending paraphernalia of vendors until such time that the vending site is properly and officially established by the Quezon City administration.



RESOLVED, FURTHERMORE, that guidelines should be formulated by the different agencies to ensure the safety and welfare not only of the vendors, but the entire general welfare of our city residents.


RESOLVED, FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), and the Quezon City Market Development and Administration Department.
