A RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING HONORABLE CITY MAYOR FELICIANO R. BELMONTE, JR., TO REQUEST THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS TO CONSIDER THE POSSIBILITY OF CONSTRUCTING A COVERED PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS ACROSS COMMONWEALTH AVENUE AT THE VICINITY OF THE ST. PETER CHURCH, BARANGAY COMMONWEALTH, QUEZON CITY.



Belmonte, Jr., to request the Department of Public Works and Highways to consider the possibility of constructing a covered pedestrian overpass across Commonwealth Avenue at the vicinity of St. Peter Church, Barangay Commonwealth, Quezon City.
