

There shall be priority for the needs of the underprivileged, sick, elderly, disabled, women and children. Section 4, Article XV of the Constitution further declares that it is the duty of the family to take care of its elderly members while the State may design programs of social security for them

WHEREAS, having an undated and official data on the exact number of senior citizens in our city and in each every barangays will greatly help in the decision making and policy direction of the city including the delivery of basic services and other projects designed for the benefits and welfare of the senior citizens in our city; not to mention the fact that aforementioned official data/information is necessary and vital among other purposes;

WHEREAS, there is a need to have an updated available data regarding the total population of senior citizens in Quezon City,



WHEREAS, in order that the city government will have an official and updated data on the exact number of senior citizens within its jurisdiction, it is imperative that a census and survey in each and every barangay in Quezon City be immediately conducted.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to enjoin, as it does hereby enjoin all Barangays in Quezon City to conduct a survey/census in their respective jurisdiction to determine the exact number of the population of Senior Citizens in their respective barangay


RESOLVED, FURTHER, the Barangay Operation Center (BOC) is hereby directed to coordinate, supervise and monitor the activity and to ensure the involvement of all Barangay Officials pertaining to the conduct of survey and census of the exact number of senior citizens in each respective barangay.

RESOLVED, FINALLY, the Barangay Operation Center (BOC) is hereby tasked to collect the said census to be submitted to the City Council.
