RESOLUTION NO. SP- **6075**, S-2014

A RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE FIRST DEATH ANNIVERSARY OF MANUEL "NONOY" S. BUNCIO AND STRONGLY AND UNANIMOUSLY RECOGNIZING HIS EXEMPLARY LEADERSHIP AS HEAD OF THE TASK FORCE COMMONWEALTH FROM JULY 8, 2010 TO OCTOBER 2, 2012.

WHEREAS, Manuel "Nonoy" S. Buncio, former Chief of the Task Force Commonwealth, had faithfully served Quezon City in various capacities, died at the age of seventy-two (72) years old;

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2012, Manuel "Nonoy" S. Buncio was reportedly standing in front of the Task Force's Outpost in Commonwealth Avenue when four men on two motorcycles passed by and shot him on his face and chest that caused the Task Force and the City Government to mourn;

WHEREAS, Task Force Commonwealth was created pursuant to Executive Order No. 5, Series of 2010 issued by Honorable City Mayor Herbert M. Bautista to implement a comprehensive, integrative and sustainable program that will address the problems of Traffic, PUJs, Tricycles, Colorum, Illegal Terminals, Illegal Markets, Sanitation, Illegal Structures, Illegal Vendors, Obstructions of Sidewalks, Easements, Waterways, Peace and Order and/or other acts of lawlessness, within the radius of two (2) kilometres of NEWS (North, East, West, South) specifically within the Litex, IBP Road, Manggahan, Kasunahan/Kasunlaran/Kahaparan Streets up to Soliven Road up to the other side of Commonwealth, Riverside, Commonwealth Market, Villonco, Bicol/Leyte, Odigal and Don Fabian;

WHEREAS, under the leadership by the then Chief Manuel "Nonoy" C. Buncio, Task Force Commonwealth carried out its mandate by maintaining peace and order, security, discipline and proper regulation within its area of jurisdiction through the following programs and projects:

- a. Campaign against illegal vendors;*
 - b. Deployment of Police officers to the area;*

- c. Confiscation of jeepney barkers' paraphernalia which obstruct traffic flow along Commonwealth Avenue and a violation of the city ordinance on anti-barkers;
- d. Confiscation of double dead meats "bocha" from the illegal vendors;
- e. Livelihood Programs for Commonwealth area vendors; of the city health;
- g. Construction of Four Hundred Forty Nine (449) Stalls (at 1.5 meters each) were assigned to former illegal vendors; and
- h. shows innovativeness by making improvised traffic cones.


WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government and the people of Quezon City express deep sense of grief and gratitude to Former Task Force Commonwealth Chief Buncio for his unselfishness, bravery, lifetime dedication and firm principled leadership in promoting the welfare of the people of Quezon City.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to commemorate, as it does hereby commemorate the first (1st) Death Anniversary of Manuel "Nonoy" S. Buncio and strongly and unanimously recognizing his exemplary leadership as Head of the Task Force Commonwealth from July 8, 2010 to October 2, 2012.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the family of the late Former Task Force Commonwealth Chief Buncio.
