RESOLUTION NO. SP- 6109, S-2017

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE HERBERT M. BAUTISTA, TO EXTEND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF FIVE THOUSAND PESOS (P5,000.00) EACH TO THE TWO HUNDRED FIFTY (250) INFORMAL SETTLER FAMILIES AFFECTED IN THE CONCRETE WIDENING/CONCRETING WITH DRAINAGE AND SIDEWALL IMPROVEMENT OF BIR ROAD, QUEZON CITY (PAG-ASA SCIENCE GARDEN TO QUEZON AVENUE), TO BE TAKEN FROM THE FUNDS OF THE OFFICE OF THE CITY MAYOR OR FROM ANY AVAILABLE FUNDS OF THE CITY TREASURY.

*WHEREAS*, the road widening and concreting with drainage and sidewalk improvement of BIR Road, Quezon City, amounting to eleven million five hundred thousand pesos (P11,500,000.00) under FY-2013 DPWH infrastructure program to maximize the road high of way, enhance authentic view and to complete the road system in this area;

*WHEREAS*, that the aforementioned project was already bid-out last November 15, 2012. The project scope of work include three (3) lanes (3.4m wide each) concrete widening; concrete curb and gutter/sidewalk (1.8m wide) and drainage improvement installation of 36" DRCCP;

*WHEREAS, the Quezon City Second Engineering District (NCR-DPWH) requested the local government of Quezon City addressed to Hon. Herbert M. Bautista for the removal of (250) informal settlers directly affected by the proposed widening project;*

*WHEREAS, Section 28 (b) of Republic Act No. 7279, otherwise known as the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992, provides that eviction or demolition may be allowed when government infrastructure project with available funding are about to be implemented;*

*WHEREAS, the Housing, Community Development and Resettlement Department (formerly Urban Poor Affairs Office) in accordance with the National Housing Authority's data identified qualified beneficiaries of the financial assistance to be extended to affected settler families;*


*WHEREAS, the National Housing Authority informed the Quezon City government that NHA is offering alternative housing assistance options for qualified and disqualified informal settler families and thereby, the National Housing Authority requested the Quezon City government for additional financial assistance in the amount of five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per informal settler family as an additional incentive for the two hundred fifty (250) informal settler families for relocation.*

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED,** to authorize as it does hereby authorize the City Mayor, Honorable Herbert M. Bautista, to extend financial assistance in the amount of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) each to the Two Hundred Fifty (250) informal settler families affected in the concrete widening/concreting with drainage and sidewalk improvement of BIR Road, Quezon City (PAGASA Science Garden to Quezon Avenue) to be taken from the funds of the Office of the City Mayor or from any available funds of the City Treasury.

**RESOLVED, FURTHER,** that the Housing Community Development and Resettlement Department shall identify the informal settler families who are beneficiaries of this financial assistance from the six hundred (600) families based on its census or inventory.

**RESOLVED, FURTHERMORE,** that the inventory of the beneficiaries of the financial assistance shall be made an integral part of this resolution.


