**A RESOLUTION URGING THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT TO EXPEDITE THE IDENTIFICATION OF BUILDABLE SPACE AND CONSTRUCTION OF SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE WHOLE DISTRICTS OF QUEZON CITY, PARTICULARLY IN THE SECOND DISTRICT.**

*WHEREAS, under Republic Act No. 10533 or "The Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013", additional two years of senior high school from grade 11 to grade 12 shall be implemented in 2016;*

*WHEREAS, under the K-12 senior high school program, students can choose any one of these Tracks, to wit: Academic, Technical-Vocational-Livelihood, Sports and Arts. The objective is to provide the students sufficient time for mastery of concepts and skills, develop lifelong learners, and prepare them for tertiary education, middle-level skills development, employment, and entrepreneurship;*

*WHEREAS, District II currently has six (6) public high schools namely, J.F. Belmonte, Holy Spirit, Justice C. Palma, Commonwealth, Batasan and Bagong Silangan, with a total of forty thousand and four hundred sixty (42,460) students for school year 2013-2014;*

WHEREAS, among the six Districts, District II has the largest number of expected senior high school enrollees with approximate of eleven thousand two hundred sixty one (11,261) Grade 11 enrollees;


WHEREAS, the Division of City Schools in coordination with City Planning and Development Office has identified the areas for senior high school buildings along Republic Avenue, a

No. 10533 by urging the Quezon City Government to promptly identify strategic locations for the construction of senior high school buildings specifically for Justice C. Palma, Commonwealth, and Holy Spirit but also in other districts in order to accommodate enrollees by 2016 onwards.
