RESOLUTION NO. SP- **6159** , S-2014

A RESOLUTION URGING ALL RESTAURANTS, FASTFOOD CHAINS, BARS, BISTROS, CAFÉS, COFFEE TEA HOUSES, DINERS, GRILLS, PIZZERIA, SNACK BARS, MOVIE HOUSES AND THE LIKE, LOCATED IN QUEZON CITY TO GRANT TEN PERCENT (10%), DISCOUNT TO ALL QUEZON CITY HALL EMPLOYEES FROM OCTOBER 1 TO 31, 2014, IN COMMEMORATION OF THE CITY'S 75 YEARS OF EXISTENCE.

WHEREAS, milestones from the history of the Philippines transpired within the City's territory, some of which are the Cry of Pugad Lawin; Battle of Payet; and the People Power Revolution of 1986;

WHEREAS, the National Assembly of the Philippine Commonwealth passed Commonwealth Act 502, known as the Charter of Quezon City, originally proposed as Balintawak City. Hence, through the efforts of Assemblymen Narciso Ramos (father of President Fidel V. Ramos) and Ramon Mitra, Sr. (father of the late Speaker Ramon Mitra, Jr.) who successfully lobbied the Assembly to name the city after the then incumbent president, Quezon City was established on October 12, 1939;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 333 was signed by President Elpidio Quirino on July 17, 1948, declaring Quezon City to be the capital of the Philippines until the law was amended in 1976;) *K* *S* *J*

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2014, Quezon City will commemorate its 75 years of existence;

WHEREAS, in full accord of this City's accomplishment and success, the City Council is proud to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the City.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge all restaurant, fastfood chains, bars, bistro cafes, coffee tea houses, diners grills, pizzeria, snack bars movie houses, and the like, located in Quezon City, to grant ten percent (10%) discount to all Quezon City Hall Employees from October 1 to 31, 2014 in commemoration of the City's 75 Years of existence.



RESOLVED, FINALLY, that the discount mentioned above will not apply when the employee is in the coverage of a higher privilege granted by law or ordinance (Senior Citizen, PWDs or Solo Parent, among others).


