A RESOLUTION ADOPTING TWO MORE COLORS TO REPRESENT THE TWO NEW LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS IN THE EXISTING COLOR SCHEME FOR LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS AS PROVIDED BY RESOLUTION NO. NC-270, S-89 ALSO KNOWN AS "A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A COLOR SCHEME FOR THE FOUR COUNCILOR DISTRICTS OF QUEZON CITY IN ORDER TO FACILITATE, THROUGH COLOR DISTINCTION THE DELINEATION OF THE RESPECTIVE TERRITORIAL EXTENT OF EACH OF THE COUNCILORS DISTRICT.

*WHEREAS, Resolution No. NC-270, S-89 also known as "adopting a color scheme for the four councilor districts of Quezon City in order to facilitate, through color distinction the delineation of the respective territorial extent of each of the councilor districts" provides for the various colors which will represent the first four legislative districts of Quezon City;*

*WHEREAS, the said colors are being used in street sign, public buildings and the like in order to facilitate the delineation of the respective territorial extent of each legislative districts;*

*WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10170, also known as "AN ACT REAPPORTIONING THE SECOND (2nd) LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT OF QUEZON CITY, THEREBY CREATING TWO (2) ADDITIONAL LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS AND TWELVE (12) SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD SEATS FROM SUCH REAPPORTIONMENT", created two additional legislative districts bringing the total to six (6) districts in Quezon City; x*

WHEREAS, there is a need to adopt two additional colors to represent the two legislative districts.


NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to adopt, as it does hereby adopt two more colors to represent the two new legislative districts in the existing color scheme for legislative districts as provided by Resolution No. NC-270 S-89, also known as "Adopting a color scheme for the four councilor districts of Quezon City in order to facilitate, through color distinction the delineation of the respective territorial extent of each of the councilors district".


RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the color scheme for the six (6) districts shall be as follows:

1 <sup>st</sup> District.. ..	Royal Blue
2 <sup>nd</sup> District.....	Yellow
3 <sup>rd</sup> District.....	Red
4 <sup>th</sup> District.....	Emerald Green
5 <sup>th</sup> District.....	Apple Green
6 <sup>th</sup> District.....	Sky Blue


