WHEREAS, Dr. Juan M. Flavier graduated with a degree in medicine from the University of the Philippines Manila-College of Medicine in 1960 and a Masteral Degree in Public Health from Johns Hopkins University in 1969;

WHEREAS, in 1967, Dr. Juan M. Flavier became the President of the Philippine Rural Reconstruction Movement and then President of the International Institute of Rural Reconstruction from 1978 to 1992;

WHEREAS, from 1992 to 1995, Dr. Juan M. Flavier served as Secretary of the Department of Health. As Secretary of Health, he initiated various successful health programs such as Oplan Alis Disease, Kontra Kolera, Stop TB, Araw ng Sangkap Pinoy, Family Planning, and Doctor to the Barrios Program. He also implemented the first Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) prevention program in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, Dr. Juan M. Flavier was elected Senator in the 1995 National Elections and subsequently re-elected for another term in the 2001 National Elections;

WHEREAS, as a distinguished Senator of the Republic of the Philippines, Senator Juan M. Flavier authored and sponsored numerous important and landmark legislations such as the Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, the Tobacco Regulation Act, the Traditional Medicine Law, the Poverty Alleviation Law, Clean Air Act, Indigenous People's Rights Act, Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2001, National Service Training Program for Tertiary Students of 2002, Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, Plant Variety Protection Act, and the Philippine Nursing Act of 2002;

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2014, Dr. Juan M. Flavier, a distinguished resident of Barangay Culiat, Quezon City, died of pneumonia-related sepsis and organ failure at the Intensive Care Unit of the National Kidney and Transplant Institute.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to extend, as it does hereby extend its sincere condolences and deepest sympathy to the bereaved family of the late former Secretary of Health and Senator of the Republic of the Philippines, Dr. Juan Martin Flavier.
