A RESOLUTION STRONGLY SUPPORTING HOUSE BILL NO. 5071, ENTITLED "AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL IN BARANGAY TANDANG SORA, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY, TO BE KNOWN AS TANDANG SORA SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR."

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10533, otherwise known as the Enhanced Basic Education Act, strengthened the education curriculum to include at least one (1) year of kindergarten education, six (6) years of elementary education, and six (6) years of secondary education;

WHEREAS, secondary education now includes a two-year senior high school (SHS) curriculum wherein students can choose to specialize among the following tracks: Academic; Technical, Vocational, and Livelihood; Sports; and Arts and Design;

WHEREAS, there is a shortage of high schools in the 6th District of Quezon City. Currently, twelve (12) public elementary schools send their graduates to only five (5) available public high schools;

WHEREAS, the implementation of the SHS is a challenge that needs to be addressed considering that the existing public secondary schools in the District are already overcrowded;


WHEREAS, to prepare the District for the full implementation of the K-to-12 Program, there is a need to establish a senior high school in Barangay Tandang Sora that will absorb the junior high school graduates of several high schools in the surrounding area.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to support, as it does hereby strongly support House Bill No. 5071, entitled "An Act Establishing a Senior High School in Barangay Tandang Sora, District 6, Quezon City, to be known as Tandang Sora Senior High School, and Appropriating Funds Therefor."


