RESOLUTION NO. SP- 6425 , S-2015

A RESOLUTION URGING THE SCHOOLS DIVISION SUPERINTENDENT, DIVISION OF CITY SCHOOLS, QUEZON CITY, TO ENJOIN ALL SCHOOL HEADS IN ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOLS TO POST A PICTURE OF COMMONWEALTH PRESIDENT MANUEL LUIS QUEZON IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE TO COMMEMORATE THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE PHILIPPINES, AND THE ACKNOWLEDGED FATHER OF QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, President Manuel Luis Quezon of the Commonwealth Government, forerunner of an independent Republic of the Philippines, was born on August 19, 1878 in Baler, Tayabas province;

WHEREAS, President Quezon had an excellent education for his time. His mother was his first teacher from whom he learned his ABC's and catechism of the Catholic faith. At the age of seven (7), his parents sent him to a parish priest who taught him the rudiments of history, geography, religion and Latin;

WHEREAS, he obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree at San Juan de Letran College in 1894 when he was sixteen (16) and subsequently finished his law course at the University of Santo Tomas;

WHEREAS, by his long and patriotic service rendered to our country and people, as an officer of the Revolutionary Army, as Provincial Fiscal, as Provincial Governor of Tayabas, as Member of the Philippine Assembly, as Resident Commissioner in the Congress of the United States of America, as Senator and President of the Philippine Senate, and as President of the Philippines, he has been recognized as a great national leader in our struggle for political emancipation, as a champion of our people's rights and liberties, and as the most zealous guardian of our country's welfare, prosperity and happiness;

WHEREAS, as President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, he signed Commonwealth Act No. 502, entitled "An Act To Create Quezon City" on October 12, 1939;

WHEREAS, his famous statement "I dream of a capital city that politically, shall be the seat of the national government, aesthetically, the showplace of the nation..." inspired and motivated leaders of this jurisdiction to blaze the trail in this path in order to attain this vision and became the present Quezon City – the place to be.

## NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the Schools Division Superintendent, Division of City Schools, Quezon City, to enjoin all school heads in public elementary and high schools, to post a picture of Commonwealth President Manuel Luis Quezon in a conspicuous place to commemorate the former President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, and the acknowledged Father of Quezon City.
