RESOLUTION NO. SP- 6429 , S-2015

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE QUEZON CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL TO CONDUCT RAPID DAMAGE ASSESSMENT AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (RDANA) TRAINING AND TO UTILIZE THE AMOUNT OF FOUR HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED THIRTY TWO PESOS (PHP410,832.00) FROM THE LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND (LDRRMF).

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster and Risk Reduction Management Act of 2010, mandates the Office of the Civil Defense (OCD) to institutionalize Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA);

WHEREAS, Rule 7, Section 3G of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the said law states that the Office of the Civil Defense is tasked to formulate Standard Operating Procedures for the deployment of Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis teams, information sharing among different government agencies, and coordination before and after disasters at all levels;

WHEREAS, Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) is a training course intended to determine the immediate impact of the disasters and cater to the priority needs of the people. In general, RDANA works by providing a quick "snapshot" of the disaster situation. It determines the type and extent of damages brought about by a disaster, including its secondary threats, the critical needs of the affected population, and the local recovery activities. It also serves as a basis for recommending the need for international assistance, if necessary;

WHEREAS, Section 21 of R.A. No. 10121 provides for the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund. Not less than five (5%) of the estimated revenue from the regular sources shall be set aside as the LDRRMF to support disaster risk management activities such as, but not limited to, pre-disaster preparedness programs including training, purchasing life-saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines, for post-disaster activities, and for the payment of premiums on calamity insurance.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to authorize, as it does hereby authorize, the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council to conduct Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) Training and to utilize the amount of Four Hundred Ten Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Two Pesos (Php410,832.00) from the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF).
