RESOLUTION NO. SP- **6596**, S-2015



A RESOLUTION STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE PASSAGE OF SENATE BILL NO. 5780 WHICH AIMS TO GIVE HONOR TO ALL FILIPINO CENTENARIANS BY PROVIDING THEM A CASH INCENTIVE OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (PHP100,000.00), AND A LETTER OF FELICITATIONS FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9994, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010, mandates the Government to adopt measures whereby our senior citizens are assisted and appreciated by the community as a whole and to establish a program beneficial to the senior citizens, their families and the rest of the community they serve;

WHEREAS, recent studies disclosed that the life expectancy of Filipinos is seventy-one (71) years old. Hence, living to be a centenarian, or three decades past the life expectancy is an achievement and a distinction worthy of emulation and public recognition; }


WHEREAS, it is but imperative for the Quezon City Government to support the passage of Senate Bill No. 5780 in view of the fact that it owes the senior citizens so much for the progress and development that Quezon City has achieved thus far, and it is a way to show them honor as well as its sincere gratitude and great respect;

WHEREAS, the 19th City Council approved Resolution No. SP-5888, S-2014, which intends to make Quezon City a "Senior Citizens Friendly City".


NOW, THEREFORE,
