WHEREAS, the then Philippine Senator, Joker Paz Arroyo, died late Monday, October 5, 2015 at the age of 88, in San Francisco, California, United States of America, due to heart failure;

WHEREAS, Senator Arroyo is a Filipino statesman and a key figure in the 1986 EDSA People Power Revolution which ousted the late strongman, President Ferdinand Marcos;

WHEREAS, Senator Arroyo also served as Congressman of Makati for nine (9) years and later as member of the Philippine Senate for twelve (12) years and has received various awards and commendations for his significant contributions to the law profession and public service. Among these are the Philippine Bar Association's Most Distinguished Award for Justice as a "man beholden to no one except to his country" and a Senate Resolution No. 100 enacted in the 8th Congress commending him for his invaluable services to the Filipino people;


NOW, THEREFORE,


