*WHEREAS, Section 1, Article XIV of the 1987 Philippine
Constitution provides that the "State shall protect and promote the right
of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take
appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all";*

*WHEREAS, the National Capital Region (NCR), also known as
Metro Manila, is considered as the Philippines' premier region being the
center of political, cultural, and economic activities, as well the key
driver of urban development in the country;*

*WHEREAS, DepEd NCR is composed of 16 schools divisions and
17 cities and municipalities. To date, its school population is served by
516 public elementary and 456 public junior and senior high schools,
complemented by 1,982 private pre-schools, 2,122 private elementary
schools, 965 private junior high schools and 721 private senior high
schools serving more than 2.8 million children in the region;*

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WHEREAS, DepEd recognizes that while national and local government efforts have produced major gains in access to education, the biggest challenge today is quality;

WHEREAS, a consultative and collaborative efforts from cities and municipalities in Metro Manila is essential to the provision of sustainable quality education and in identifying challenges and strategic interventions in the areas of urban development and disaster preparedness;


WHEREAS, the establishment of a National Capital Region Education Council spearheaded by DepEd NCR will serve as the platform in the formulation of policies, plans, and programs relevant to the well-being of our learners among representatives from all cities in the region.
