

Belmonte, City Mayor, and the honorable members of the Quezon City Council, decided to allocate funds in the amount of One Billion Pesos (Php1,000,000,000.00) to purchase the necessary vaccine to be given free to all willing residents of Quezon City, and as such, entered into tripartite agreement with AstraZeneca and DOH for its immediate implementation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to strongly urge, as it does hereby strongly urge, all residents of Quezon City, more particularly the Senior Citizens, Persons with Disability and Solo Parents to avail of the Quezon City Government free vaccine against COVID-19 to avoid and stop the spread of the disease.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that copy of the herein Resolution shall be forwarded to the Office of the City Mayor, to the Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD) and to the one hundred forty-two (142) Barangays in Quezon City for information and appropriate action.
