WHEREAS, the Society for Philosophy and Psychology (SPP) is a professional organization in North America that held its inaugural meeting in 1974 at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), aiming to promote discussion and research at the intersection of philosophy, psychology and cognitive science;

WHEREAS, since it was first awarded in 1997, only 25 persons have been awarded this prize, named after William James, whose work in the disciplines of physiology, psychology and philosophy influenced generations of thinker in Europe and America, and was instrumental in the establishment of the Harvard University's psychology department;

WHEREAS, Joan Danielle K. Ongchoco, a Ph.D. graduate student in Cognitive Psychology at Yale University, received the said prize during the 47th annual meeting of SPP for her outstanding work "Figments of imagination: Scaffolded attention creates non-sensory object and event representations";
