A RESOLUTION URGING THE SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION (SEC) TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF EMAILS AND CELLPHONE NUMBERS OF TODA/PUV ASSOCIATIONS AND COOPERATIVES AS PRESCRIBED IN THE MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 28, SERIES OF 2020 WITHOUT PENALTY DUE TO THE ADVERSE EFFECT OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC TO THE TRANSPORT SECTOR.

WHEREAS, after a year of COVID-19 pandemic, there is no doubt that the transport sector was one of the most affected sectors, particularly on the economic aspect;

WHEREAS, the travel restrictions that were put in place to minimize the spread of the virus hindered the capabilities of tricycle, jeepneys, buses and other transportation companies to transport passengers from and to different places;

WHEREAS, the transport sector becomes the recipients of the financial aid from the Local Government Units and from the National Government;

WHEREAS, the Memorandum Circular No. 28, Series of 2020 issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission is within the timeline that the transport sector was under stressful condition even though the said memorandum was extended until February 23, 2021;

WHEREAS, the concerns of the transport sector are worthy of consideration to give them some leeway and some more time in the preparation and submission of the documents stipulated in Memorandum Circular No. 28 of the Securities and Exchange Commission without penalty.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) to extend the deadline for the submission of emails and cellphone numbers of TODA/PUV Associations and Cooperatives as prescribed in the Memorandum Circular No. 28, Series of 2020 without penalty due to the adverse effect of COVID-19 pandemic to the transport sector.
