A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR TO DONATE TWENTY MILLION PESOS (Php20,000,000.00.) TO VARIOUS LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS BADLY AFFECTED BY SUPER TYPHOON ODETTE.

WHEREAS, on December 16, 2021, super-typhoon Odette (international name Rai) ravaged the Southern and central regions of the Philippines. It is the strongest typhoon to hit the country this 2021;

WHEREAS, before it exited the Philippines on December 18, 2021, initial reports showed that the super-typhoon Odette displaced more than 100,000 people, killed around a hundred people, and destroyed several billion pesos worth of property across Visayas and Mindanao;

WHEREAS, the people of Quezon City are devastated by the reports of the horrendous suffering wreaked by the super-typhoon and sympathize with the plight of those affected;

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2021, the 21st City Council passed a resolution granting financial assistance of Ten Million Pesos, or One Million pesos each to badly affected 5th and 6th class municipalities of Southern Leyte: Anahawan, Hinundayan, Libagon, Padre Burgos, Pintuyan, San Francisco, San Juan, San Ricardo, Tomas Opus and Limasawa;

WHEREAS, there are still more affected local government units in the Visayas region that need the city's urgent help;

WHEREAS, under Section 455 (b)(1)(vi) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, the City Mayor shall represent the City in all its business transactions and sign in its behalf all bonds, contracts, and obligations, and such other documents upon authority of the Sangguniang Panlungsod or pursuant to law or ordinance;

WHEREAS, Section 33 of the Local Government Code provides that local government units may "consolidate, or coordinate their efforts, services, and resources for purposes commonly beneficial to them".

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to authorize, as it does hereby authorize, the city mayor to donate Twenty Million Pesos (Php20,000,000.00) to various local government units badly affected by the Super Typhoon Odette, broken down as follows:

5. Tayasan	Php1,000,000.00 or One Million Pesos

7. La Libertad	Php1,000,000.00 or One Million Pesos
8. Vallehermoso	Php1,000,000.00 or One Million Pesos
