A RESOLUTION EXTENDING DEEPEST CONDOLENCES TO THE BEREAVED FAMILY OF THE LATE PHILIPPINE PRESIDENT, GENERAL FIDEL VALDEZ RAMOS AND EXPRESSING GRATEFUL RECOGNITION TO HIS INVALUABLE AND EXEMPLARY CONTRIBUTION TO THE COUNTRY.

WHEREAS, Former President Fidel Valdez Ramos was born on March 18, 1928 to Representative and former Secretary of Foreign Affairs, Atty. Narciso Ramos and Educator, Mrs. Angela Valdez-Ramos, in Lingayen, Pangasinan, Philippines, and grew up in Asingan town during his childhood;

WHEREAS, Former President Fidel Valdez Ramos is married to Amelita Martinez on October 21, 1954, and together they have five daughters: Angelita Ramos-Jones, Josephine Ramos-Samartino, Carolina Ramos-Sembrano, Cristina Ramos-Jalasco and Gloria Ramos:

WHEREAS, Former President Fidel Valdez Ramos went to the United States Military Academy at West Point where he graduated in 1950 and has received several military awards including the Philippine Legion of Honor (18 March 1988 and 19 July 1991), the Distinguished Conduct Star (1991), the Distinguished Service Star (20 May 1966, 20 December 1967, and 3 August 1981), Philippine Military Merit Medal (23 May 1952), the U.S. Military Academy Distinguished Graduate Award and Legion of Merit (1 August 1990), and the French Legion of Honor;

WHEREAS, Former President Fidel Valdez Ramos won the seven-way race on May 11, 1992 and served as the 12<sup>th</sup> President of the Philippines from 1992 to 1998;

WHEREAS, Former President Fidel Valdez Ramos was the first and only Protestant to be elected as President of the majority-Catholic country and the only Filipino officer in history to have held every rank in the Philippine military from Second Lieutenant to Commander-in-Chief;

WHEREAS, the contribution of Former President Fidel V. Ramos extends not only to his lengths of service to the military but to the development of the country's peace and order from the time of the 1986 EDSA People Power to his invaluable contribution to the country as its President.
