*WHEREAS, the Ten Accomplished Youth Organizations (TAYO) Awards, now on its 21<sup>st</sup> year, continues to be the Country's premier award-giving body for youth organizations, recognizing exemplary contributions to nation-building;*

WHEREAS, the youth of Quezon City are recognized as key partners in local governance and nation-building, serving as catalysts for progressive change and as advocates for the marginalized sectors of society;

WHEREAS, among the awardees and finalists at the 21<sup>st</sup> TAYO Awards held on August 19, 2024 at the Manila Metropolitan Theater were several youth organizations from Quezon City whose projects demonstrated outstanding impact on their communities;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Anti-Discrimination Alliance of Youth Leaders (PANTAY), Inc., represented by Aaron James L. Villapando, was named among the 10 TAYO Awardees for its Project GEIS (Gender Equality Index for Schools), which aims to assess and improve schools' responsiveness to sexual orientation, gender identity, and expression (SOGIE) inclusivity and equality;

WHEREAS, the Model SK Network, represented by Nestie Bryal C. Villaviray, was recognized as a TAYO finalist for its project IpanaLOKAL: Training Series on People's Participation and Governance, and was given the YouthLed Democracy Award for its contributions to promoting governance and people's participation in local government through the Sangguniang Kabataan;

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Young Leaders Coalition, represented by Ricardo V. Vidal Jr., was recognized as a TAYO finalist for its project KAPEBILIDAD (Kamalayan, Adbokasiyo, Kapansanan, Edukasyon), which advocates for Persons with Disabilities by promoting awareness, education, and capacity-building;

WHEREAS, the outstanding achievements of these youth organizations serve as an inspiration to the youth of Quezon City, encouraging them to become more involved in their communities and to continue pursuing innovative solutions to the challenges faced by society;


